CHAIRMAN'S REPORT, March 2005 – September 2006

The year and a half since the last AGM has been both busy and eventful.

Our monthly programme of talks has covered a wide variety of topics in meetings held in a variety of locations. The full extent of our interests is described in detail in the Summary of Activities made available to you. We have been fortunate in the calibre of speakers we have been able to attract – all of them giving freely of their time. In addition to our normal run of meetings, the Forum received extensive recognition for the part played in securing and arranging a very well-received interview, at Glasgow University, with the departing Principal Conductor of the RSNO, Alexander Lazarev, who received an Honorary Professorship from the University. Equally successful was our sponsorship of the Boris Akunin interview with Ian Rankin at the Edinburgh Book Festival last year. This really was an interested, full-house affair. These two events have to be regarded as major coups by the Forum.

Among our other special events was the noteworthy All-day Conference on Business Opportunities in Russia in April 2005, and our recent close involvement with the visit of the Cultural Mission of St Petersburg to Scotland aimed at promoting closer ties between our two countries. We were the joint organisers, with Edinburgh City Chambers, of a reception held in their honour, as well as contributing to the arrangements made for discussion meetings with representatives of cultural and educational circles at the Universities of Edinburgh and Glasgow. This is the point where I must thank the Russian Consulate, and in particular, Mr Vladimir Malygin and Mr Nikita Matkovsky, for the prominence afforded the Forum in this stimulating, and it is to be hoped, fruitful, series of meetings. Our corporate membership continues to grow as does our personal membership – we now have 180 members. Encouragingly, the proportion of Russian or FSU-born members has also gone up. And although most of our members live in or near Edinburgh this pattern is gradually changing.

Developments during the year have encouraged us to reconsider our existing Constitution. We now have draft proposals designed to make the best use of the talents, interests and energies of Forum members with fewer general meetings and more specialised steering groups. We want to see practical outcomes which can benefit the whole organisation. You will also hear from Ian on the the current state of his investigation into the pros and cons of charitable status. I would like to record our appreciation for all the detailed work and not inconsiderable time he has put into clarifying and presenting these legal issues – as well as ensuring we remain financially healthy!

You will be aware that our Hon. Secretary, Jenny Carr, was in the US for five months over the summer. In her absence - only physical I have to say, for her email had a long reach – various responsibilities were devolved to Ann Caldwell, Peter Harvey and Neville Long. I should like to thank them for the willingness which they displayed in coping with their new tasks.

The existence of our website and Newsletter owes much to the hard work and time invested in both enterprises by Helen Williams. She has asked to be released from these heavy commitments and we are fortunate that Ann Caldwell has agreed to take on responsibility for the Newsletter while Ilya Kuznetsov has taken over responsibility for updating the website. I should like to thank them for all the hard work involved.


Three of our existing Committee members – Peter Harvey, Lara Ryazanova-Clarke and Helen Williams – have come to the end
