#### Structure, governance and management

#### Type of governing document

The Forum is a charitable unincorporated association and the purposes and administration arrangements are set out in our constitution. The constitution was most recently altered on 8 June 2007 and recognition as a Scottish Charity was gained on 20 September 2007.

#### Trustee recruitment and appointment

The Forum's Trustees (Committee) are appointed or reappointed by the members at our annual general meeting. The Committee has the power to co-opt up to two members of the Forum to the Committee.

### Objectives and activities

#### Charitable purposes

Our purposes, as recorded in our constitution, are to advance education through the promotion of a clear understanding in Scotland, Russia, and the countries of the Former Soviet Union, of the respective ways of life, history, heritage and the cultural and commercial activities and voluntary services of the said countries and through the creation of educational contacts of all kinds between the peoples of these countries.

# Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The Forum arranges a programme of lectures and exhibitions each year, publishes 'The SRF Review' twice a year, circulates a weekly information bulletin by e-mail and provides information through its website. The Forum rented premises to house a Russian cultural centre, with rental and associated costs met for three years by a donation from Scottish and Newcastle plc, in June 2008. As well as meetings of the Forum, the centre hosts art exhibitions featuring works from or about Russia and the other countries of the Former Soviet Union.

## Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

A cultural centre, 'The Scotland-Russia Institute', was opened in Edinburgh in September 2008. Rental and associated costs for three years are met by a donation from Scottish and Newcastle plc. An 'Awards for All' Lottery grant enabled the Centre to be equipped and furnished. The Centre has allowed the Forum greatly to expand and enhance its activities, and the Forum experienced growth in all areas, including a 26% increase in membership. Among the Forum's activities were a programme of talks, ranging from 'Russia and the Credit Crunch' to 'Pushkin in Russian, Scots and English' and 'The Silk Road'; a series of exhibitions, including contemporary paintings, photographs and textiles; and performances of Georgian and Uzbek music. The number attending events rose from approximately 350 per annum before the Centre opened to over 1000, and there were almost 2000 visitors to the Centre, mainly for exhibitions, during the financial period. Language classes have begun on a regular basis and contacts have been established for the placement of Language Assistants in Russian Universities and places of Higher Education. A lending library has been opened.

Two issues of the SRF Review were published during the year with a range of feature articles and reviews. The weekly e-mail bulletin was circulated to some 500 members and non-members with information on events and activities relevant to the Forum's objects.

The Forum's website was extended and improved and serves as the primary source of information about the Forum and its activities.

#### Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

As a result of the surplus of £5739 in unrestricted funds for the year, the Forum held unrestricted funds of £10039 at the year end which will support the Forum's general activities in the coming year and allow subscription rates to be maintained at the current level. A total surplus of £21638 in restricted funds will allow the Forum to meet its commitment to funders to operate a cultural centre in Edinburgh for a minimum of three years to June 2011.
